“Train Your Brain to Heal Your Life”

Have you wondered about neurofeedback for mental, emotional, and physical health? Not all neurofeedback is the same. This presentation will explain about this active method of brain training, based on updated classic theory, which trains the whole spectrum of the five main frequency bands treated in neurofeedback.
